





REPORT BY THE CHIEF MEDICAL OFFICER

Dr. H S Sankhla, MBBS, MS(ENT)(RTD) with an experience of 36 years, heads the school Medical Department. Under his supervision, Mr. Sunil Kumar, GNM, (Senior male nurse) and Mr. Vinod Kumar, GNM, (Male Nurse) work to ensure best medical facilities are given to the students and the staff.

At our school, health and hygiene have always been a top priority, and in the post-pandemic era, we have taken even stricter measures to ensure a healthy and vigorous environment for our students. We conduct routine health checks twice a year to monitor our students' height, weight, and other health parameters. Additionally, we provide daily OPD services to any sick students who require medical attention. Our school is equipped with air-conditioned indoor facilities and an isolation ward for the observation and treatment of sick students. We also have 24x7 emergency services available to provide immediate medical assistance whenever needed.

To ensure the highest health and safety standards, our Principal initiates regular meetings with our medical staff. In December, we conducted an emergency meeting to take necessary action to prevent the spread of viral fever in the hostel due to the sudden cold wave. Our school also avails the services of other specialist doctors as and when required for our students' health needs. We believe that good health and hygiene are essential for our students' overall well-being, and we are committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for them to learn and grow.

REPORT BY THE ACADEMIC COORDINATOR

The rich legacy of more than a century old school speaks itself. Our culture and traditions are so deep rooted that we fascinate others. Our School is a mix of traditional yet modern learning styles. We are nurturing young learners in an eco-system where curriculum transaction is designed in such a way that students learn without stress and fear of books. The boarding school is not confined to the four walls but extends far beyond. The Eco Park in Pilani introduces nature, and the rich flora; Birla Science Museum is like a blank canvas that excites and motivates students to be inquisitive; week long workshops are organized for the students on the concept "Learning by doing". The Birla School is further extended to another study station in Pilani called Birla Naturopathy Center where meditation and yoga are of prime importance, the concept here is to develop a healthy mind and body; Birla Farmhouse is another field trip often organized for the students where visualization of lush green fields, cattle amaze the students and indirectly takes them to the real time events as per their curriculum.

Educational Tours and treks are organized thus extending the learning beyond the classrooms. The students aspiring for JEE/NEET exam, are provided with special coaching classes to guide and mentor them by professional teachers. The student's involvement in morning assemblies and celebration of special international and national days, apprise them of various current and historical events and celebrations thus guide them to be confident and fluent speakers. In order to maintain a high physical standard, Horse Riding, Swimming, and Karate, Cricket, Football etc. are organized in the evening sports hour. There is a residential doctor who takes care of them.

Every Sunday special Aradhana (Prayer) is organized in the school hall. Such multiple learning pedagogy is coordinated only and only in a boarding school, where students learn so many aspects at one place. This factor is actually missing in Metro cities. As learning is a slow and continuous process, one must now understand that Boarding school provides the holistic development of a child polishing them to be confident and sparkling jewels of the society. 
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The department of Social Science also carries out various activities throughout the academic year to promote the holistic development of students.



VISIT TO BIRLA NATUROPATHY CENTER AND FARMHOUSE

The purpose of the activity was to see various agricultural equipments, different modern irrigation systems, different horticultural plantations, and to generate awareness about different agricultural practices and crop management.

Under the supervision of teachers, students saw different irrigation techniques drip and sprinkler irrigation systems, different plantations like that of jojoba, Ber, Beal, Kinnow, pomegranate, lemon and learnt the concept of mixed cropping. Students learnt about sustainable agricultural techniques and the natural way to increase soil fertility by intercropping and saving water, space and soil quality like growing gram as an intercrop with kinnow and ber plantations.

Students got a privilege to see various tools and equipment used in agricultural practices and were able to establish relations of learning through their observation and real life. Students learned the utility and relevance of the equipment like harrow, planer, rotavator, disc plough, moors plough, pit digger, bund former, combine harvester etc. in farms.

BIRLA SCHOOL, PILANI VISIT to BIRLA SCIENCE CENTRE



THE OLDER COUSIN TO EARTH

The newly discovered Kepler-452b is the smallest planet to date discovered orbiting in the habitable zone -- the area around a star where liquid water could pool on the surface of an orbiting planet -- of a G2-type star, like our sun. The confirmation of Kepler-452b brings the total number of confirmed planets to 1,030.

"On the 20th anniversary year of the discovery that proved other suns host planets, the Kepler exoplanet explorer has discovered a planet and star which most closely resemble the Earth and our Sun," said John Grunfeld, associate administrator of NASA's Science Mission Directorate at the agency's headquarters in Washington. "This exciting result brings us one step closer to finding an Earth 2.0."

Kepler-452b is 60 percent larger in diameter than Earth and is considered a super-Earth-size planet. While its mass and composition are not yet determined, previous research suggests that planets the size of Kepler-452b have a good chance of being r

While Kepler-452b is larger than Earth, its 385-day orbit is only 5 percent longer. The planet is 5 percent farther from its parent star Kepler-452 than Earth is from the Sun. Kepler-452 is 6 billion years old, 1.5 billion years older than our sun, has the same temperature, and is 20 percent brighter and has a diameter 10 percent larger.

"We can think of Kepler-452b as an older, bigger cousin to Earth, providing an opportunity to understand and reflect upon Earth's evolving environment," said Jon Jenkins, Kepler data analysis lead at NASA's Ames Research Center in Moffett Field, California, who led the team that discovered Kepler-452b. "It's awe-inspiring to consider that this planet has spent 6 billion years in the habitable zone of its star; longer than Earth. That's substantial opportunity for life to arise, should all the necessary ingredients and conditions for life exist on this planet."

To help confirm the finding and better determine the properties of the Kepler-452 system, the team conducted ground-based observations at the University of Texas at Austin's McDonald Observatory, the Fred Lawrence Whipple Observatory on Mt. Hopkins, Arizona, and the W. M. Keck Observatory atop Mauna Kea in Hawaii. These measurements were key for the researchers to confirm the planetary nature of Kepler-452b, to refine the size and brightness of its host star and to better pin down the size of the planet and its orbit. The Kepler-452 system is located 1,400 light-years away in the constellation Cygnus. The research paper reporting this finding has been accepted for publication in the astronomical journal

In addition to confirming Kepler-452b, the Kepler team has increased the number of new exoplanet candidates by 521 from their analysis of observations conducted from May 2009 to May 2013, raising the number of planet candidates detected by the Kepler mission to 4,696. Candidates require follow-up observations and analysis to verify they are actual planets.

Twelve of the new planet candidates have diameters between one to two times that of Earth, and orbit in their star's habitable zone. Of these, nine orbit stars are like our sun in size and temperature.

"We've been able to fully automate our process of identifying planet candidates, which means we can finally assess every transit signal in the entire Kepler dataset quickly and uniformly," said Jeff Coughlin, Kepler scientist at the SETI Institute in Mountain View, California, who led the analysis of a new candidate catalog. "This gives astronomers a statistically sound population of planet candidates to accurately determine the number of small, possibly rocky planets like Earth in our Milky Way galaxy."

STARS

Stars are the most widely recognized astronomical objects and represent the most fundamental building blocks of galaxies. The age, distribution, and composition of the stars in a galaxy trace the history, dynamics, and evolution of that galaxy. Star Formation.

Stars are born within the clouds of dust and scattered throughout most galaxies. A familiar example of such as a dust cloud is the Orion Nebula. Turbulence deep within these clouds gives rise to knots with sufficient mass that the gas and dust can begin to collapse under its own gravitational attraction. As the cloud collapses, the material at the centre begins to heat up. Known as a protostar, it is this hot core at the heart of the collapsing cloud that will one day become a star. Three-dimensional computer models of star formation predict that the spinning clouds of collapsing gas and dust may break up into two or three blobs; this would explain why the majority the stars in the Milky Way are paired or in groups of multiple stars.

As the cloud collapses, a dense, hot core forms and begins gathering dust and gas. Not all of this material ends up as part of a star — the remaining dust can become planets, asteroids, or comets or may remain as dust. Stars and their fates.

In general, the larger a star, the shorter its life, although all but the most massive stars live for billions of years. When a star has fused all the hydrogen in its core, nuclear reactions cease. Deprived of the energy production needed to support it, the core begins to collapse into itself and becomes much hotter.

Staff Corner TO CHAT GPT OR NOT TO

In January 2023, when I heard the conundrum regarding ChatGPT, I decided to try it and was surprised to notice that it is rather a valuable resource for my classroom. I discovered that I can use ChatGPT to achieve a variety of learning objectives depending on my students' needs and goals. It can help students practice various language skills, receive immediate feedback, and engage in active learning.

Many times, the students are hesitant to ask questions, not able to understand how to answer a question, give irrelevant details while answering a question, cannot remember the new word/ phrases taught in the class and many such problems are faced by our students. It can now be easier if they can use ChatGPT constructively.

As teachers it is our responsibility to teach our students to use a resource for their benefit. For language class, if we can ask the students to do things in a certain manner, I am sure it would be helpful for them to be independent learners. Here are some examples:

Develop Close Reading Skills

Students can read short passages/ poems and then ask questions to explore and deepen their understanding of the text like, "identify the key theme, ideas, or literary devices, arguments presented in the chapter/ poem", "Summarise the text" or "Expand a particular point with everyday examples"

Help in preparing the Short Research Project

Students of classes 11 & 12 can now use ChatGPT to develop questionnaires, ask for feedback on their report and thus prepare the research project well.

Helpful in Writing Process

Many students are wary of writing and if it comes to writing an essay, an article or a report, they get anxious but if they are given a few prompts or an introduction by ChatGPT, they will know how to begin, which points to cover and how to end their writing question.

Edit Students' work

We can ask our students to upload their essay and ask ChatGPT to identify and correct errors or areas for improvement, proofread, remove redundant words, check for coherence and underdeveloped arguments, to generate alternative phrasing or wording for specific sentences or paragraphs, which can help to refine writing style and improve the clarity of argument.

Getfeedback

This valuable resource can not only point out mistakes, but also give appropriate feedback on the quality of work- appropriate use of words, alternate vocabulary, sentence structure, tone of writing etc, and improve the overall coherence and effectiveness of your argument.

However, it is important to remember that technology is not inherently good or evil. ChatGPT itself is a neutral tool, and how it is used depends on the intentions of those who use it.

CHERISHING THE MEMORIES

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When the entire world was recovering after Covid-19, we got a lucrative chance to participate in a trekking and adventure camp in Jhandi Dhara village in Kalimpong, Darjiling district in West Bengal. Jhandi Dhara is a village on the bank of the confluence of five rivers- Geet Khola, Chel khola, Ghees Khola, Reel Khola and Jholdhaka. Our trekking trip started on 21" May 2022 under the guidance of Durgapur Mountaineering Association, an institute that has successfully celebrated its golden jubilee. The trip was organized for age groups ranging from age 5 to 55. Various activities were planned according to the age groups. Ages 5 to 12, were taught to read compass, learn directions, star gazing in the night sky, learn local music and dance, survival in harsh conditions and identifying local flora and fauna. The best thing was that they became familiar with lichens and survived in a place where lichens were common. We, the elders, learned the tricks for trekking and were familiarised with the local lifestyle and daily routine. Main occupation of the village is cardamom cultivation, other than cultivating maize and rearing cattle. People communicate in Lepha language. It is very impressive that local people use symbolic sounds to communicate in emergencies. There are 70 families sharing a strong bond. The food habits are the same as the people of West Bengal like rice, dal, egg, chicken, and fish for lunch. And on foggy nights, they eat roti and sabji. The months of May and June witness heavy rainfall and sudden temperature fall especially in the evenings and mornings. It was fascinating to see them getting water supply from natural streams and thus sharing a close relation with flora and fauna. As a social science teacher, it was fascinating experiencing nature too closely and enjoying every moment. I felt so rejuvenated to see the kids enjoying being with new friends, adventure, and sports. Another commendable thing is that all the children collected polyethene from the area. 25th May was our last day in Jhanti Dhara, so children organized a campfire with many songs and cultural activities. This trekking trip was a freshening experience for us. I hope more and more of us undertake such a summer camp with our kids as it is good for the Mind, Body and Soul.

KNOWING OUR LEARNERS

Every child is unique vis-à-vis social-economic backgrounds, behavior, capabilities, learning styles, and value systems. It is imperative for a teacher to know their students, how they learn best, what they do well, how to cater to diverse needs and meaningful access to curriculum, student accomplishments, and what to assess. In my opinion, the challenges to learning are: -

Multiple means of engagement to tap into learner's interests, challenge them appropriately, and motivate them to learn.

Multiple means of expression to provide learners alternatives to demonstrate their knowledge.

Multiple means of reflection: to give learners various ways of getting information and enhancing knowledge. It is essential to ensure that no child is left behind.

Our students learn both visually and socially, quickly collaborate with unique conversation through words images, videos, multimedia (memes, gifs etc.) which drives them to learn. We observe changes in not only learners but also their learning process, and hence becomes significant to change our teaching methods and learning tools, adoption to technology is inevitable to bridge the learning gaps.

I find that as I moved from behaviorist-cognitivist-constructivist continuum, there is a drastic shift from passive transfer of facts and following general routines to active application of ideas to more authentic and real-life problems. It helped me to know which theory is most effective in fostering mastery of specific tasks by specific learners and helped me to recognize it touches which domain of bloom's taxonomy. Humanist theory helped me gauge whether my student is sad, or distressed and cannot focus (Maslow's hierarchy of needs): what alterations in the classroom environment can create a safe, learning environment. Gardener's theory of multiple intelligence enables me to know that each learner is different and possesses a different learning style. Theories of learning are the spine of fundamental pedagogical approaches; and also pave the way for instructional design which helps to decide the adoption of teaching -learning strategies which enhance learning.

For resolving inattentiveness and increasing participation, I use the strategy think pair and share, move physically closer, regrouping. For argumentative behavior, the five golden points are staying composed, using break time to talk, confer privately, avoid heated discussion, and providing feedback. For unpreparedness: give short surprise quizzes, share common study questions with time limits—more particular and timely correction of work. For avoiding rambling and reluctance to participate, treating students with respect, refrain from any embarrassment, help them to motivate and focus by breaking a massive task into small bite-sized manageable tasks (eat the elephant), getting ahead by getting started (pick off goblins), eliminating distractions (ignore siren's song), no procrastination (using egg timer method), For difficult situations without judging, after encouraging the expression of discomfort seek the help of a counselor, by using emotional vocabulary tools like mood-o-meter, wheel of emotions, confidence walk we should try to instill confidence, create safe, trustful environments and expression of emotions.
